



Fire Drills & Weather Emergencies

Fire drills are scheduled and held periodically. Evacuation charts are located in each classroom. In the event of inclement weather, the children will be brought indoors.

In the case of natural disasters/weather events our youth will be taken to the safest locations within the building. Battery-operated radios are available for staff to keep apprised of such situations. Emergency phone numbers, including 911 and the Poison Control Center are posted.

Emergencies & Infectious Disease

Parents will be immediately notified in the event of a club wide emergency. Parents will be notified in writing of any infectious disease. Look for the sign up for important updates from the Heiser Crew.

SIGN IN/OUT PORICY

All summer camp members must be signed in and out each day. We require written authorization for anyone not listed on the original Summer Program application to pick up your child. Proper photo Identification is required at pickup time.

We must have a copy of the court order for anyone who is not permitted to pick up your child.

Underclothing is to be completely covered no halter tops, midriff, bikini tops, short shorts, and/or any see through clothing are not permitted. Clothing may not make reference to drugs, alcohol, tobacco products, sex, violence, death Closed toed shoes should be worn daily by all campers. Sandals and flip fops are a safety issue(flip flops are good for pool days to be worn at the pool only).

Lunch & Snacks

A morning snack is not provided however, the allotted time for breakfast is at arrival. We encourage a healthy morning breakfast.

A ready to eat bag luch is required. Please assit your child in packing a well balance lunch. Refrigerators and microwaves are not available. We suggest using an insulated bag with a coolant. Please lable lunch bags to prevent confusion.

A afternoon snack will be provided by the Heiser club.

Swim/Field Trips

Swim/Field Trips

The summer field trip permission slips must be completed. Please make sure your child understands the rules for their own safety.

During transportation all youth are required to wear their seatbelts. Youth must abide by all rules and behave appropriately. Any youth unable to to consistently follow directs pertaining to trips will lose bus privilege's. All tips are based on behavior there are no refunds for paid trips.

Camp Shirts

For safety reasons, it is mandatory that children wear their camp shirts on all field & swim trips. It makes it easier to spot youth that are in public locations.

If a child does not have the appropriate shirt for their field/swim trip day they may not participate in the trip. We do not have extra shirts to sell. Please, mark all items with your youth's name on them.

Forms of Discipline

Time Out ~Loss of activity ~ Clean up duty ~ Incident Reports ~ Suspension or Termination. Parents will be required to meet with the Director's for mediation.

If there is any type of fighting or injury to another child, the parents may be called and asked to come in for a meeting with the Director. All decisions are at the discretion of the Directors. Automatic suspension will occur if an incident is repeated after a prior suspension.

The following are reasons for immediate suspension:
Vulgar language
Cussing
Fist Fighting
Stealing,
Calling 911(prank)
Hitting a staff member
Alcohol, drugs or weapons*
Having pepper spray firecrackers

*If drugs or weapons are found, the parent & police will be called and the youth must be picked up immediately.

Parents will be called and asked to come in for a meeting with the Directors. Decisions are at the discretion of the Directors. Automatic suspension will occur if an incident is repeated after a prior suspension.

The health and safety of all youth is one of the most important tasks of The General Heiser Boys & Girls Club.



Expulsion

Children who have constant discipline problems and/or are abusive to others will be terminated.

Once a child receives 3 incident reports, he/she will be suspended.

Children may be suspended with less than 3 incident reports if the situation warrants.

Children will also be terminated for lack of payment.

Children can be terminated if a parent or guardian intimidates, threatens, or harasses another child or adult.

Rules & Regulations

Loud, abusive vulgar or aggressive language and aggressive behavior will not be tolerated while at the Boys & Girls Club or at Club sponsored activities. Staff reserve the right to send members home at any time due to a violation of the rulses.

- No smoking/vaping is permitted in or around the club.
- No eating or drinking except in designated areas.
- · No chewing gum allowed.
- Shoes and shirts are to be worn at all times.
- Pants must be worn on the waist completely covering undergarments.
- No glass bottles are allowed in the building at anytime.
- No items that may cause harm or injury to anyone.
- No running in the building.
- Basketballs may not be bounced outside the gym. Basketballs are provided, please leave your basketballs at home.
- Elementary School campers will not be allowed use of cell phones.
 Please leave them at home. If we do see them we will confiscate and return to a parent at pick up.
- Middle School campers will have a specific times to use their cell phones.
- All toys, electronics, cell phones or excessive amounts of money should be left at home.
- No destruction of club property.
- No improper usage of club equipment.

Your Child's Health Health & Medication

For children who receive medicine in our care, a medical release waiver must be on file. Medication that are intended for long-term use (inhalers Ritalin, etc.) will require a doctor's signature. Medication must in the original bottle we will not accept medication that is given as a shot (except epi-pens).

Parents will be notified if a child becomes ill. Parents will be expected to arrange immediate pick up of their child by an authorized person. If your child is injured, you will receive an accident report at sign-out. Any severe accidents will be reported immediately to the parent.

Children Must be Kept Home If:

Children Must be Kept Home If:

• They have a fever of 100 or
above, vomiting, or diarrhea or if
they have an illnesses such as
strep throat, bronchitis, or flu.
(They have to be on an antibiotic
for at least 24 hours before they
may return.)

• Your child has conditions such as head lice, pink eye, chicken pox, or contagious rashes. If we see evidence of these on your child, the child will be sent home immediately (a doctor's note will be needed stating that the child is no longer contagious).

Parents MUST notify the daycare center within 24 hrs of any contagious diseases within their household.

Allergies, Special Needs

• Parents must notify the staff of all allergies including those to food, topical ointments, sunscreen, or latex.


